## City Service

### One-way fares for buses, subways, and trolleys:

- Cash en route (exact amount only) - \$2.00 each way
- Tokens – \$1.55 each (good for one way)
- Transfer – \$1 (there is free transfer between subways)
- SEPTA rates are subject to change; see <http://www.septa.org/fares.html> for up-to-date info.

### Places selling tokens on and around the Penn Campus:

- University Bookstore - 36<sup>th</sup> & Walnut Streets
- Houston Hall - 34<sup>th</sup> & Spruce Streets
- Moravian Café - 34<sup>th</sup> & Walnut Streets
- The Fresh Grocer - 4001 Walnut Street
- 30<sup>th</sup> Street Station - 30<sup>th</sup> & Market Streets
- University City Station - Convention Ave & South Street

### SEPTA City Service around Penn:

- Market-Frankford Line “E1” (Blue Line) – runs east-west; closest entrance on 34<sup>th</sup> & Market Streets
- Subway Surface Trolleys (Green Line ) – run east-west; closest entrances on 36<sup>th</sup> & Sansom Streets and 37<sup>th</sup> & Spruce Streets (all trolleys run through campus **except** the number 10 trolley)
- Broad Street Subway (Orange Line) – runs north-south; closest entrance on Broad Street between Walnut and Locust
- Bus 21 – Runs east along Chestnut Street and west along Walnut Street
- Bus 42 – Runs east along Chestnut Street and west along Walnut Street in Center City, and along Spruce Street in West Philadelphia
- Bus 40 –Runs east along South Street in Center City and west along Lombard Street in Center City; and north along 41<sup>st</sup> Street and south along 40<sup>th</sup> Street in West Philadelphia
- Bus 30 – Runs east/west through West Philadelphia from 30<sup>th</sup> Street Station to 69<sup>th</sup> Street Terminal
- Bus 31 – Runs through West Philadelphia and Powelton Village to Center City
- LUCY (Loop through University City) – Around perimeter of campus to 30<sup>th</sup> Street Station. LUCY is FREE with your PennCard!

### University Pass

The Fall Semester 2010 PennPass goes on sale August 2, and is effective from August 23 until December 24, 2010. The PennPass is a good value if you will use SEPTA round trip at least 5 days a week. ## Regional Rail Suburban Service

### Regional Rail Train Fares

All Regional Rail stations are assigned a zone number based on their distance from Center City; ticket prices and zone designations increase accordingly. In addition, ticket prices vary depending on whether you are on a weekday or evening/weekend train, and whether you purchase your ticket in advance or on board the train. It is always cheaper to purchase your ticket in advance.

One-way Regional Rail fares from Center City range from \$3.50 to \$10, and round-trip fares range from \$7 to \$20.

In addition to single train tickets, SEPTA also offers **10-Trip** Tickets, and weekly or monthly **TrailPasses**, which provide riders with discounted fares.

### Regional Rail Train Stations around Penn:

- 30<sup>th</sup> Street Station (30<sup>th</sup> & Market Streets) – All SEPTA Regional Rail trains and Amtrak trains run through 30<sup>th</sup> Street Station. LUCY connects 30<sup>th</sup> Street Station with campus.
- University City Train Station (at the South Street Bridge near Franklin Field) – Only certain lines run through University City Train Station; check the schedules.

### Regional Rail Trains Students Use a Lot

- Airport Line -- \$6.25 advance / \$7.00 on-board one way between Center City and the Airport during weekday hours; runs every 30 minutes seven days/week
- Trenton Line (not the West Trenton Line), connects with New Jersey Transit train to New York City Penn Station. You can purchase a combined SEPTA/NJ Transit ticket at 30<sup>th</sup> Street Station. Fare is approximately \$25 one-way.
